Notable cases

R v Smallman (Teesside):

Lone Prosecution Counsel in complex fraud involving thirty-one complainants. Defendant convicted after a four-week trial, sentenced to five years' imprisonment and made the subject of a Serious Crime Prevention Order. A media report of the case can be found here.

R v A (Leeds):

Instructed on behalf of violent recidivist accused of unlawful wounding with intent. Defendant acquitted after trial.

R v Harkness & Richardson (Newcastle-upon-Tyne):

Prosecution Counsel at trial and on appeal in well planned armed robbery of a busy hair salon. Both defendants convicted, one after trial. Conviction and sentences of 9 and 10 years' imprisonment upheld by the Court of Appeal.

R v P (Teesside):

Instructed on behalf of defendant accused of assault by penetration. Acquitted after trial.

R v W (Teesside):

Instructed on behalf of sex worker accused of robbing complainant she alleged was an unsatisfied former customer. A media report of the case can be found here.

R v Gosley-Shaw (York):

Instructed to prosecute defendant accused of stealing her 89-year-old grandmother's life savings. Secured conviction of defendant after trial. A media report of the case can be found here.
